Statewide Assessments: Using Test Results Summary

MCA, MTAS, ACCESS, Alternate ACCESS

Test Results Summary provides **final summary data** at the school, district and state levels in an interactive report format.

- Available in August on the MDE website in <u>Secure Reports</u>
- Reports created by test or combined for $\mathsf{MCA}/\mathsf{MTAS}$
- Multiple ways to summarize data, including by school, grade and student groups
- All data can be filtered regardless of student group size
- Reports generated can be downloaded as PDFs or data files
- User guide available

The data is **embargoed**, which means it cannot be shared until the MDE public release of results. However, there are many ways to use this summary data during the embargo:

- Easily generate reports for student groups
- Compare school and district data with statewide data
- Create reports to share with staff for curriculum and instructional purposes (e.g., data retreats, workshops, presentations)
- Prepare communication for media and stakeholders about summary-level results
 - Select multiple grades and/or student groups
 - Select students included in groups and/or not in groups (e.g., English learner and not English learner)
 - Scroll to see multiple summary tables

These reports offer flexibility to analyze summary-level data. **Use in context** with:

Tips

- Formative and classroom assessment data
- Statewide summary data, using caution with any comparisons this year
- Information specific to your unique circumstances this year (e.g., learning models, attendance)

During the 2020–21 school year, educators and students experienced significant and profound changes in teaching and learning, as well as social and emotional well-being.

It is important to keep this in mind when interpreting assessment results, as these changes are reflected in student scores but are difficult to account for accurately.

Monitor Implementation of Standards

- The standards define the expectations for student learning and instruction.
- <u>Statewide assessments</u> are a snapshot of student learning of the standards.
- Public schools and districts use these results as one part of their <u>comprehensive</u> assessment system.

Prioritize Equity

- Information from a comprehensive assessment system can be used as a guide to ensure every student receives a high-quality education, no matter their race or ZIP code.
- Statewide assessments results can be used to look across student groups, schools and districts to identify underlying inequities and highlight promising instructional practices.

Provide Valid Results

- Minnesota educators and community members are involved in multiple steps of test development and are critical partners in this work.
- There are rigorous checks and validations of results prior to reporting.
- Both of these ensure that statewide assessment results are a valid and reliable measure of learning of the standards at the time students test.
